

Mobile Vaccination Clinic in Ocean Shores October 20th

Free COVID Vaccines Available for Children and Adults

The Care-a-Van, a mobile COVID vaccination clinic, will be in Ocean Shores from 11:00 to 1:00 on October 20th to give first and second doses for both children and adults as well as bivalent boosters. The clinic will be held at the Lions Club park adjacent to the Lions Club at 832 Ocean Shores Blvd NW.

Walk-ins are welcome. Vaccines are free. No insurance or ID are needed. Please bring your vaccination card, if you can, to shorten wait times.

Pre-registration is recommended but not required for vaccinations and boosters. Interested individuals can pre-register at the link or QR code below.

A \$50 gift card is available for those getting their first or second dose. (At this time, gift cards have not been approved for boosters.)

The mobile vaccination visit is part of a broader mobile outreach project in partnership with the Washington State Department of Health that will serve eight outlying areas of Grays Harbor County, including Ocean Shores. The MAV (Mobile Assistance Van) will take food items, COVID information and supplies, and resource information and assistance to each of the targeted communities once a month. The MAV will be onsite along with the Care-a-Van as part of the quarterly Project Connect event that brings information and resources to the North Beach area.

The MAV is a partnership of the Olympic Area Agency on Aging (O3A), North Beach Senior Center, and the Arc of Grays Harbor. Funding is provided by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, through a grant with the WA Department of Health.
